Mary Terry called the meeting to order and distributed the agenda.

Committee Reports:

Richard Roati announced another neighborhood walk-about on June 25. Jean Singleton of Tucson Clean and Beautiful will be present. People will gather at 7 p.m. Richard spoke about the buffel grass that has been seen near Winsett. Richard said that his own home will be on the watershed management tour.

MCRC--Both Mary Terry and Dick spoke about the lack of attention by Plan Tucson to the Arroyo Chico Plan. There will be a meeting with the Planning Department at 4:30 p.m. on June 19th. Dick also spoke about a proposed meeting with the Base commander, where he will give a presentation about long landings. The MCRC Ops Committee wants him to do a similar presentation in September.

We noted that Mary Terry's agenda had a great number of meetings in June that affect our neighborhood. The City meeting cited in the above paragraph on the 19th. On the 20th there are three meetings:

(1) Zoning variance requests for Roses & More; meeting with their reps at the site at 5 p.m.

(2) Broadway Corridor Task Force at 5:30 p.m.

(3) Zoning Examiner's hearing at 6:00 p.m. regarding the request for an exception to the code to permit installation of a wireless communication facility cell tower with associated ground equipment in Barrio Centro.

There was a short discussion about the topics to be addressed by the Neighborhood Preservation Ordinance: yard sales, outdoor storage, etc.

We discussed dividing up to attend these meetings.

In addition to these meeting, the Walmart liquor license application will be heard in July here in Tucson. The Liquor Board will come down from Phoenix for this occasion.

The Board discussed the upcoming July 4th Parade and who would be available to help. It seems to come together at the last minute every year.
